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
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


Virtual Parent/Teacher Conferences



Say Goodbye to Exam Phobia!

"The best way to increase confidence and reduce anxiety is to be well prepared, so start your revision early. Many tutors will build it into your course, but you will need to make your own plans as well to make sure you have covered all the topics you think you need to know."

Two months before your exams:

Now is the time to think seriously about your revision timetable. You should:

- Check the most up-to-date syllabus for every subject.
- Find out about the exam. (For example, is questions multiple choice or essay-based?)
- Prepare a revision timetable.

Some revision tips:

Try to schedule revision during the most productive times of your day. For example, if you feel fresh and alert in the morning, make sure you do most of your studying early. You should also try to.

- Prioritize exams that make up a large percentage of a subject's grade.
- Take regular breaks to refresh your mind.
- Use a variety of study tools to revise including books, audio guides, and online video summaries.
- Highlight important points in your study notes.
- Ask family and friends to quiz you on each subject.
- Practice past papers so you get a feel for the questions and timings
- Make time for relaxation with family and friends.

So, you have revised and prepared for the big day, don't worry. If you feel a little nervous – that's only natural. Follow a few more simple tips to stay relaxed and get the best possible exam results. Try to:

- Stay calm and take deep, even breaths.
- Read the exam paper completely before you start.
- Plan your time.
- Move on to the next question if you get stuck.
- Read the questions carefully and make sure you answer each one properly.
- Sip fresh water throughout the exam.
- Check each answer, particularly if you finish early.

PROGRESS IN INTERNATIONAL READING LITERACY STUDY

We would like to inform you that the Ministry of Education (MOE) has chosen Gulf International School to participate in the Progress in International Reading Literacy Study (PIRLS) exams. The exams are being conducted throughout the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and worldwide as well. We are honored to be one of the international schools asked to participate. The PIRLS reading exams will be conducted once a week for our 4th-grade students in both the girls' and boys' sections of the school. This exam is online and the results of the exams, as will the results of all chosen international schools in the Kingdom, will be used to rank and compare the Kingdom's international schools to schools around the world. It is very important that our students participate in the study and do their very best to represent Gulf International Schools as well as the country. PIRLS allows us at GIS to explore the factors which help support strong readers and allows research to drive educational policies. It is not solely about the score, but it also allows researchers to understand the interests and engagement that students have towards their learning, classroom practices, school resources, and the support at home.
