Life Skills Classes

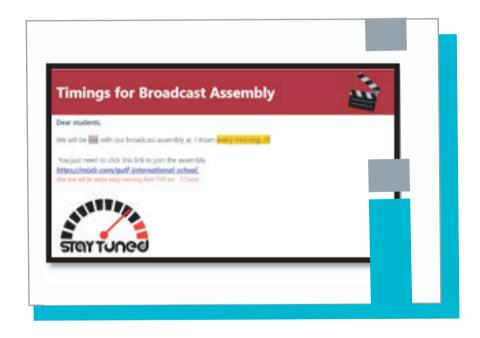

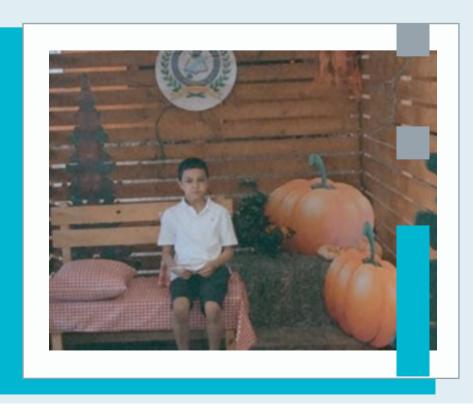






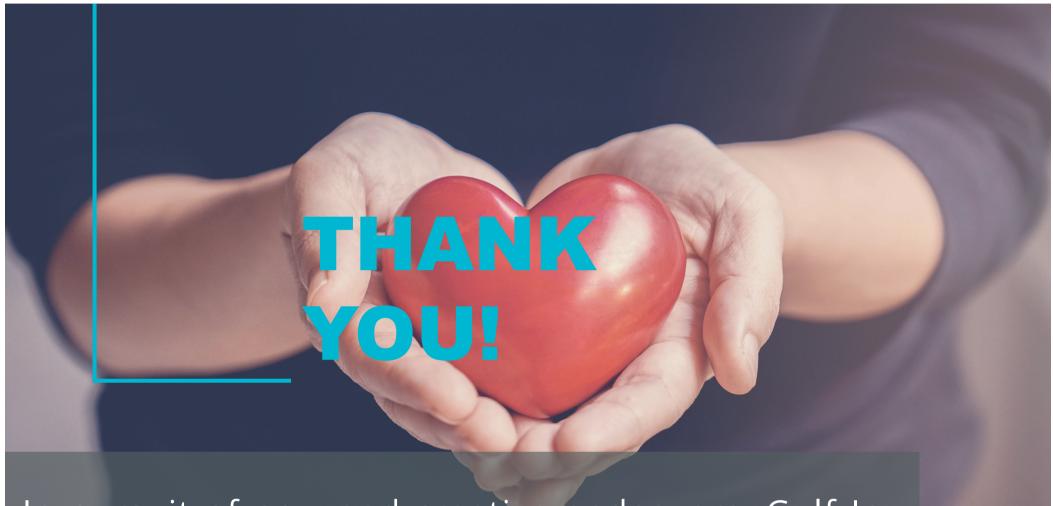








Appreciating Talents

Exam Preparations and Tips

Let's get ready for the end-of-semester exams. Mrs. Srividhya, from our school's IT management, gives us online exam guidelines. At the same time, out school counselor's, Mrs. Rasha, gives our students tips for reducing test anxiety.

Before the Online Exam: Prepare the following:

Internet

Make sure you have a good internet connection with maximum signal strength.

Do not use the internet for anything other than for your exams during the exam timings

Device

- For taking an exam, use a laptop or a tablet (preferably 10 inches or above). Please avoid using mobile phones.
- Kindly update your Teams App and Operating Systems (IOS, Windows and Android) in advance of the exams.
- Make sure you select "English" as the language preference on your device.

- Make sure your device is fully charged or connected to power.
- Close all other programs
 (WhatsApp, email, Face-book etc...).
- Restart your device 30 minutes before the exam is scheduled to begin.
- Keep a backup device ready in case of emergencies.

MS Teams

Open your TEAMS account 10
minutes before the exam is scheduled to begin. Check to be sure that you are logged in with your account.

In case of any difficulties in opening
the exam paper in the Teams App;
use Google Chrome or Microsoft
Edge browser to open Teams and
the exam paper.

Maximize the browser window before starting the test.



During the Online Exam: Focus

- Set an alarm in advance to notify you when you are running short of time (i.e. 10 minutes left).
- Do not resize the browser window or app.
- If you have any internet issues, do not refresh the exam paper, wait until the connection is restored and then continue the exam.

- Click the "Submit" button to submit your exam. Do not press the "Enter" button.
- Read or Listen to the exam guidelines carefully.
- Technical problems? Do not panic but do contact us on our school WhatsApp #050 410 8147.

Make sure your camera is turned on at all the times

Tips for test preparation to reduce stress and anxiety before taking your exam

- Prepare well for the exam

 Learn your syllabus thoroughly and organize what materials you will need for the test.
- Review your notes the night before the exam; this will leave information fresh in your memory.
- Get a good night's sleep the 3. night before the exam.

- Don't attend your exam with an empty stomach; take a small snack, or some other nourishment.
 - »Fresh fruits and vegetables are often recommended to reduce stress.
 - » Drink Water to avoid dehydration.
- Avoid speaking with fellow students who have not prepared, who express negativity, or who will distract your preparation.
- Approach the exam with confidence

Tips for test preparation during your online exam time

- Find a quiet place to take your exam where you won't be interrupted.
 - »Limit distractions by turning off anything that might distract you from the test – phone, email, TV etc.
- Make sure that all your materials are with you such as pens, pencils, erasers...etc.
- Take a deep breath! Take a moment to relax and get focused.

- Read the instructions carefully and make sure you understand the test guidelines.
- If you go blank, skip the question and go on to another one.
 - If you're taking an essay test and you go blank on the whole test, pick a question and start writing; it may trigger the answer in your mind.
- Keep time to revise your answers and check your answers before you submit them.
- »Ensure that every answer is complete and appears as you intended.
- »Review the accuracy of your answers, as well as your spelling and grammar.

b. Mid-semester break
